cease in case the legal voters of any such village or township shall so determine, by a majority vote, at any annual election held therein, and the corporate authorities of such villages or townships may exercise the same powers conferred upon the corporate authorities of cities under this act.

Sec. 11. At the next regular election, after any town, village or township shall have voted to establish a free public library, there shall be elected a library board of six directors, one-third for one year, one-third for two years, and one-third for three years; and annually thereafter there shall be elected two directors, who shall hold their office for three years, and until their successors are elected and qualified, which board shall have the same powers as by this act are conferred upon the board of directors of free public libraries in cities.

report of the condition of their trust for the year ending April 30, 1892:

The report of the acting Librarian, with its appendix, gives a fair view, both of the advance which the Library has made and its present condition, and we are sure that our next annual statement will show much greater growth than the past year does. The popularity and usefulness of this institution is evinced in the steady increase of the number of borrowers, which is now 2,336 more than it was at last report, and also in the much larger daily issue of books for home use.

Our Library is now made one of the U. S. Depositories of its public documents, so that we can expect substantial additions to the Reference Department of the Library from that source as years go on.

To the President and Board of Directors of the Free Public Library of St. Joseph:

The acting Librarian herewith presents the report of the Library for the year

ending April 30, 1892.

In November, 1891, for various reasons, it was thought necessary by the Board of Directors to secure other quarters for the library, and the building at the corner of Tenth and Sylvanie Streets was rented for one year for that purpose, the library being closed from November 7th to November 14th, for the purpose of moving.

BOOKS.

According to the last annual report, the number of volumes belonging to the library April 30, 1891, was 5,510. The number of volumes entered in the accession register during the past year was 1,264. The number deducted by wear and loss was six. The number unaccounted for was three, making a net gain of 1,255.

A statement of the number of books added to the Circulating and Reference Departments will be found in Exhibit A.

CIRCULATING DEPARTMENT.

This department has been open 302 days, being every week day in the year, except the holidays, and the days on which the library was closed for the purpose of moving. The hours are from 10 a. m. to 9 p. m. The number of books issued during the year was 92,292, the average daily use being 305. Number of borrowers' library cards issued during the year was 2,336.

READING ROOMS AND REFERENCE DEPARTMENT.

The reading rooms and reference department have been well patronized. No record has been kept of the number of visitors to these departments during the year. These departments have been open every day during the year except the holidays. The hours being from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m., every day except Sanday, when the hours are from 2 to 6 p. m.

CATALOGUE.

In May, 1891, a classified list of the books in the library was published, its expense being borne by advertising.
