



Library Awarded Summer Reading Grant

Have you heard the great news? The St. Joseph Public Library was recently awarded \$15,432 in grant funding to support the 2018 Summer Reading Program by the Offices of John R. Ashcroft, Secretary of State. With this funding, the library will offer expanded programming opportunities and will provide weekly entertainment programs throughout the 2018

"Libraries Rock" Summer Reading Program. While we have generous support from the Friends of the Library, supplemental grant funding allows us to purchase more program supplies, books, and movies, and it improves the overall quality of library programs available to our community.

The reading program runs June 1 - August 1 this summer, and will include an all-ages reading initiative, eight weekly performers, weekly storytimes, music programs, and more. Much of the grant funding will be dedicated to support programs that center on arts and music, in addition to books and reading. Some of the new programming developed for the summer reading program includes a Theremin building class, sing-along movie nights, music-driven storytimes featuring a gamut of rhythm instruments, bi-monthly ukulele clubs, weekly craft programs at neighborhood branches, and more.

Grant funding has been instrumental in allowing us to expand programs and services for all ages—and we have a lot of fun things planned for the 2018 Summer Reading Program. With over 100 programs slated for the summer months, we are ready to rock—we hope you'll join us in the fun!
