Friends of the St. Joseph Public Library Upcoming Book Sales

The Friends of the St. Joseph Public Library just wrapped up the annual fall book sale at the East Hills Shopping Center. Thanks to the support of the community, the Friends raised over \$12,000 to help offset the cost of the Summer Reading Program and book giveaways at PumpkinFest and Juneteenth Festivals.

Just around the corner are some more opportunities to shop for gently used books.


