Tumblebooks: E-books for E-kids!

The Missouri State Library purchased a state-wide license to the **Tumblebooks** Library.

To see what Tumblebooks are all about visit the "Kids" section of the library website at sjpl.lib.mo.us and follow the link.

The Tumblebooks Library is a collection of TumbleBooks (animated, talking picture books) with fiction, non-fiction and foreign language titles, Read-Alongs (chapter books with sentence highlighting and narration but no animation), *TumbleTV* which consists of preset playlists of a sequence of books and Tumble Puzzles & Games. TumbleBooks are created from existing picture books which have been licensed from children's book publishers and converted to the TumbleBook format.

Downtown Library's Family Place I-2-3 Play with Me! Sessions and Baby Storytime!

Children first begin learning through play, and the library is thrilled to encourage that through our Family Place child education area. In February of 2013, the Downtown Library became the first Family Place Library in Missouri and continues to be a great destination for families with young children. When developing Family Place Libraries, the driving motivation was to give parents a place to interact with their children and other families. It is not structured



playtime, but a space to enjoy playing with early developmental toys. The Family Place mini library has many books for parents who may want to know how better to deal with tantrums, potty training, getting your toddler to sleep and all the other challenges parents face. There are also board books perfect for little hands.

Family Place is more than a destination for kids, it is a philosophy of education and wellbeing for the whole family. To achieve this, we offer fun and relaxing sessions for parents and children twice a year. Each week, a different early childhood professional joins the group to answer questions regarding a different theme. The themes are Early Literacy, Nutrition, Speech and Language, Music and Playtime for Learning, and Emerging Behaviors. Parents have found these sessions to be a comfortable, non-judgmental place to ask questions, share stories and meet other families. As parents take turns speaking with the guest speaker, children play with toys that are just perfect for them. Most of the time, parents have very similar concerns, so there's a lot of group discussion and play going on the whole time. The sessions are designed for families with children aged 1 to 4 years of age. Space is limited and registration is required, so call the Downtown Children's Library to be put on the reservation list. The next session begins Friday, September 2 at 10 a.m.

We are also excited to be able to offer Baby Storytime in our Family Place for the first time this Fall. Every Monday at 9:30 a.m. beginning September 12th, parents are invited to join Miss Misty for a storytime perfectly suited for babies from birth to 18 months old. This is a perfect opportunity to introduce babies to the library and make library visits a rewarding habit for the whole family.

We invite families to come and visit our Family Place, whether it's for learning or play, because ultimately it becomes both!

Peter and the Starcatchers by Dave Barry and Ridley Pearson







You will need to register to vote if you have never registered before or if you have moved. Library staff can register only those living in Buchanan County, but can provide information on how to get registered regardless of where you live.



Eligible by Curtis Sittenfeld


