LIBRARY CLOSING INFORMATION

In a continued effort to protect the health and safety of our patrons, staff, and community during the COVID-19 outbreak, and in response to the extension of the St. Joseph stay-at-home order, the St. Joseph Public Library will remain closed through at least April 30, 2020. This includes all programs and outreach services.

SJPL does not charge overdue fines and all checkout periods for items not yet due will be extended again to May 15. All pending holds are frozen so no one will lose a book they couldn't pick up or lose their place in line.


SJPL is offering virtual programming on <u>Facebook</u> and <u>YouTube</u> and you can connect to both on our <u>website</u>.
