



create, to curse, to cure—and to kill.




## Invisible Ghosts by Robyn Schneider



depraved. Behind her blue eyes and sweet smile lies the calculating heart of a girl determined to stay alive no matter the cost.




#### Drums, Girls and Dangerous Pie
