Library News

A Message from Your Library

The St. Joseph Public Library is blessed to be associated with two 501c3 organizations that exist to support the library and our community. The Friends of the St. Joseph Public Library was created in 2003 and the St. Joseph Public Library Foundation followed in 2007.

The Friends have a Board of Directors and a membership of around 130 people. They primarily raise funds through book sales and work closely with our Outreach and Promotions Coordinator, Crystal Stuck, to manage the sales. The Friends' largest yearly expense is the library's annual Summer Reading Program, which would not be possible without their support.

The Foundation has a Board of Directors, but is not a membership organization like the Friends. The Foundation manages two trusts on behalf of the library and encourages donations to help build a basis of perpetual support for the library. Laura Hutton was a vibrant young woman and nearly three years ago her family asked that donations be sent in her memory to the Library Foundation in order to purchase pet and animal related books for the East Hills Library. Over \$16,500 has been donated in Laura's memory to date and the donations will allow us to purchase books for many years to come.

Two years ago the Foundation began an annual fundraiser, *Books, Beers and Boos,* held at River Bluff Brewing. It is no surprise that the event was canceled this year and I am sad I didn't get to add a third commemorative mug to my collection. Not to worry, *Books, Beers and Boos* will be back next October!

The Foundation has held an annual fundraising drive each November and that is one activity that can safely continue this year. The Foundation will use the funds raised this year during the drive to help the library purchase children and teen e-books. The St. Joseph Public Library is working with the St. Joseph School District to provide access to children and teen e-books to students directly through the schools, without having to get a library card. I am grateful the Foundation was so willing to help us purchase e-books for this important endeavor.

There are all sorts of ways to support the library and they include using online library resources, checking out materials, volunteering your time, donating used books and DVDs, becoming involved in the Friends or Foundation, and making a donation to the Friends, Foundation, or library. The library staff and I appreciate all the different ways you show your support of the library and together we will continue making a positive impact in St. Joseph!
