Library-By-Mail brings the library right to your door. All qualifying residents of the St. Joseph Public Library District can receive library materials through the mail free of charge. You qualify if you are temporarily or permanently homebound and live in the library district.

Books, including large print versions, magazines, music CDs, audiobook CDs, and DVDs are all available through the Library-By-Mail service.

To sign up, start by calling the Library-By-Mail department at 236-2107 or send an email to librarybymail@sjpl.lib.mo.us. Staff will confirm your eligibility and you will receive an application in the mail. Once the completed application is returned to the library, Library-By-Mail staff will contact you to find out what types of materials you would like to receive.
