Early February, a young man named Marshall Hoffman donated one of the most extraordinary items we've had the privilege of receiving. It was an original map of the Stockyards from 1899 when South Side was called St. George, as it had not yet been incorporated into the City of St. Joseph.

We were astounded and so grateful that such an impressive piece of our city's history would be donated. The best part is that when the library receives donations of this kind, we do our best to make them accessible to everyone. They don't simply get cataloged and filed away. We first go through the process of proper preservation, then scan them to make them available online when we are able.



She frequently updates our digital archives with items to make research easier for everyone. Jennifer wrote and received a grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State with additional funds from the Shirley Bradley trust for a new scanner to aid in this process

and has been able to increase the clarity of items and speed with which

they are added online.

We are grateful to our patrons who share their family's treasures with us. The library is about access. 
Seed Library at the Downtown and East Hills Libraries

The St. Joseph Public Library's Outreach Department has moved into the Downtown Library in a space once occupied by the St. Joseph School District. Previously located at the East Hills Library, the Outreach Department oversees the Friends of the Library book sales. The Friends will now be able to have their book sales in the library instead of finding an offsite location for sales. This will save the Friends rental and moving expenses. It is anticipated that the first sale in the new space will be the vintage and collectible sale sometime this summer, followed by the fall book sale in October.
