A Message from Your Library

Stay safe, stay well, and stay warm!

Goodbye and good riddance 2020. Hello 2021, and boy, am I happy to see you! It is nice to have something to look forward to and it is especially nice after the letdown of the holiday season in the dark of winter.

I am looking forward to the library's upcoming Winter Reading Challenge that we are offering for the first time in January. It's not going to be a complicated program, we are just asking people to log the number of books they read using the Beanstack app or website: <u>siplibrary.beanstack.org</u>. Library staff is also happy to track reading progress for anyone not interested or able to track with Beanstack. All patrons who participate in the program are eligible to get a prize in February. To make the challenge even more fun a couple of people have agreed to get pied if some benchmarks are met. If 500 books are read Jen Wildhagen, Branch Manager of the Downtown Library, will have a pie thrown in her face and Mayor Bill McMurray has agreed to be pied if 1,000 books are logged. Bless them both and I personally promise the pies will be tasty.

I am also looking forward to the other upcoming programs that our talented librarians and library friends will be presenting. From early literacy storytimes to crafts to book clubs to history topics to . . . the list goes on. You can find out about these programs right here in the January/February newsletter. I am looking forward to welcoming folks back into the library when the number of new COVID-19 cases in Buchanan County drops and we are back to the yellow risk level according to Harvard's Global Epidemics website: <u>globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-</u><u>suppression/</u>. SJPL has been following the website since July to help us make decisions about the level of face-to-face services we offer.

I am looking forward to continuing to serve you, whether virtually, curbside, or in person in 2021. When 2020 started I never imagined the reality of our lives at the end of the year. However, we made it through the challenging year and though I am sure 2021 will have its own challenges, I know we will be able to live life more face-to-face as the year progresses and I am very much looking forward to that too.



January 1 - 31, 2021

From January 1st to January 31st, St. Joseph Public Library will participate in Beanstack's Fourth Annual Winter Reading Challenge, "Books Like Us," sponsored by Simon and Schuster (S&S). We challenge our patrons of all ages to read at least 1 book during the month to help us meet our community goal of 500 books read in January. All you have to do is keep track of your reading on our Beanstack site at <u>siplibrary.beanstack.org</u>. Join us and the thousands of other libraries and schools across the nation to read a target number of books.

Each reader will be eligible for a goodie from the library available for pickup in February. You'll also be eligible to win a prize from Simon and Schuster. Prizes will include book collections and virtual author visits. Ten (10) winning schools or libraries will each get a collection of fifty (50) books from the "<u>Books Like Us</u>" collection. When we meet our community goal, we'll also "Pie a Librarian" live on the library's social media channels! If we double our goal (read 1000 books), we'll pie Mayor Bill McMurray!
