

A Message from Your Library

The library's biggest program by far is the annual Summer Reading Program. It is so important that we have a staff committee that spends months planning it. This year's theme is Oceans of Possibilities and it begins on June 1. We'll have weekly performers at each branch during June and July and a Kick-off Party at the Washington Park Library on June 4.

The Summer Reading program offers all ages, from babies to adults, fun prize incentives to promote reading throughout the summer. Our goal is for school age children and teens to keep reading during the break. It's a proven way to stop the "summer slide" when those hard earned academic gains made during the school year are lost during the summer. Our experienced library staff is here to help by providing reading recommendations for students at all reading levels, from preschool through high school.

Our librarians are ready to help readers of ANY age find the right book or books, just for them. I am probably preaching to the choir here because you are reading the SJPL newsletter, but reading is important for adults too. It can reduce stress and promote relaxation along with improving concentration, memory, and vocabulary. Finally, you can learn something, even from a fun summer read.

So even though we are going to reward you with prizes just for participating in the Summer Reading Program you will get all kinds of other benefits too. Frankly, you've got nothing to lose and lots to gain by reading with us this summer.

In addition to offering our weekly Summer Reading programs at all the branches, have you discovered what other programs are available? The Book Buddies Reading Dogs are back! The Book Buddies Pony Express Therapy Dogs visit the East Hills Library on the first Saturday of the month from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. The dogs can help children improve their reading skills in a unique and fun way. Therapy dogs offer their ears as they listen to children of all ages and reading levels. Families are welcome to drop by at any time during the two hour session for some low-stress reading time with a friendly dog.

How does Family Storytime in the Park sound? Miss Amanda at the Carnegie Library hosts the Family Storytimes on the second and fourth Saturdays of June and July at 3 p.m. Bring the whole family for a fun time with stories and crafts.

Have you made it back to the Friends Front Row Movie series? Bob Shultz hosts these showings of movies chosen for adults every Tuesday evening at 6:30 p.m. at the East Hills Library. We invite you to enjoy a movie and popcorn on us.

Read on in the newsletter to find out about other programs and activities at SJPL this summer. We hope you will visit the library, sign up for the Summer Reading Program and explore the possibilities we have on offer.
