A Message from Your Library

Are you ready for summer at the library? This year's Summer Reading Program theme is Adventure Begins at Your Library. Summer Reading Programs began to be offered at public libraries in the 1890s to encourage school-age children and teens to read during the summer break and develop the habit of reading for pleasure. One reason the programs have continued is that they have been shown to reduce the summer slide, or a dip in reading skills, when students return to school in the fall. Another reason they continue is simply because they are fun.

SJPL is changing the program this year. The Summer Reading Program is just for youth. Anyone from birth to 17 years old can participate by reading or listening to books and earn prizes. Don't worry adults, our Winter Reading Program will be back in January and that reading program is just for you.

Summer is fun at the library with all kinds of programs planned from special performers in June to storytimes, to crafts, to science experiments, to theater camp, to movies in the park and more. Babies, children, and teens may be the only ones earning prizes, but we have plenty of fun and engagement in store, whatever your age.

One program I would like to highlight is Throwback Thursday Movies at the Carnegie Library. The program is made possible through an Urban Homestead Neighborhood Revitalization grant and the St. Joseph Public Library Foundation. Thank you to the City of St. Joseph and South St. Joseph Development Corporation for providing the grant. The grant funded new furniture in the park at the Carnegie Library, including the purchase of outdoor movie equipment. Thanks also to the St. Joseph Public Library Foundation. They stepped in to fund the movies we'll be showing the last Thursday of the month in June, July, August, and September. Monarchs Begin Their Adventure at the Library




