

Library News

Library's Response to COVID-19

Library services have changed in ways I could not have imagined way back in February. Our whole world has changed since then. Some changes may be permanent while other things that we take for granted now, such as standing far away from acquaintances while talking, will certainly change once the COVID-19 pandemic is over.

We closed to the public on March 18 and almost immediately began offering virtual programming on YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, and Discord. It has been fun and inspiring to see our library staff quickly become experts at online programming. Those programs have ranged from storytimes to book clubs to local history to crafts to true crime and more. We're going to continue that online programming until it is safe for larger groups to gather again at the library.

We adapted other library services by offering e-content only library cards to anyone who lives in St. Joseph who didn't already have a library card in good standing. We also didn't want our fabulous seed library to go to waste and have mailed out over 750 packets of seeds.

We began contactless checkouts at all branches on May 7 and computer access by appointment at the Downtown Library on May 14. I don't know who was happier with this, our library staff who are thrilled to be providing more traditional library services again or you, our patrons who are so happy to have new books to read again. Even though you can't come in and browse the stacks right now, our library staff is happy to expertly pick out books if you don't have specific book titles in mind.

Our contactless service also includes printing and weekly craft kits this summer for kids and families.

Our Summer Reading Program, *Imagine Your Story*, will be virtual this year thanks to a great app called Beanstack. All ages can still participate, there will still be prizes, and library staff can still help you track your progress toward prizes if you can't or don't want to use Beanstack.

I can't tell you when we will be opening our doors again to the public. We are adhering to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines that state we shouldn't reopen to the public until the number of new COVID-19 cases in St. Joseph are flat or reduced for 14 consecutive days. Just know that when we can safely reopen, we will. In the meantime we are happy to continue to provide you books, movies, music, magazines, and more through our contactless service. And if you need to use a computer, call us at 232-4038 to schedule an appointment.

Thank you for your patience and we are looking forward to the day when we can welcome everyone back into the library!

2020 Summer Reading Program

"Imagine Your Story" is the theme for this year's Summer Reading Program. Could you have ever imagined that the library would be closed for the start of summer reading? That you wouldn't be able to visit and pick out books, get your prizes or watch fabulous performers? While this may be true this year, don't worry. Summer Reading is going virtual!

Signing Up & Tracking Reading: All you need to do is go to siplibrary.beanstack.org and register yourself or your family. Once registered, you log your reading, earn badges, reading rewards and entries to win extra prizes. All prize pickup will be done through the library's Contactless Pickup system. The Summer Reading Program is open to all ages, babies through adults.

Summer Reading Performers: Summer reading performances will be posted on the library's Facebook page. Some performances can also be found on our YouTube channel and our Instagram page. Performances will be available for viewing for a limited time, so don't miss out on your favorites. Here are the performers and the date their performance will be posted.

June 3: Remington Nature Center - Shelly Cox from the Remington Nature Center will share stories about salamanders and snakes and introduce us to some that you might see if you visit the Remington Nature Center.

June 10: Exotics R Us - Presented by Exotics R Us, an educational outreach program in Kansas City, MO that specializes in bringing the wild to YOU! Learn about each animal's habitat, where they are from, diet, and status in the wild.

June 17: Monster Magic Variety Extravaganza Bonanza - Presented by Jeanie Puppets, watch monster puppets Charles & Benny host their very first virtual puppet variety show which includes magic, music, dancing and lots of silliness, but things don't always go as planned and the results are hilarious. Special guest appearances by Celia and other puppet characters!

June 24: Figment Follies with Will Stuck - Two episodes of fun! The Figment Follies (15 minute show) is a bite sized show for the 7 and younger crowd featuring a fairy tale story and super silly song! The Figment Follies (30 minute show) features Will's MESS (Music, Education, Stories & Science) with an imagination and fairy tale spin!

July 15: Frio the Dragon: Quest for Fire! - Presented by Mad Science of Greater Kansas City. Join Frio the Dragon as he discovers how he can breathe fire with the help from a wizardly scientist! 


