

St. Joseph Public Library Oral History Project

The St. Joseph Public Library is all about local history and we want to hear from you. We want to hear your history and your family's history as it pertains to the history of St. Joseph. Armed with these personal narratives, the library will create an archive about the people and places of this area in the unique voice of those who lived them.

The project will focus on capturing and preserving local stories in audio format. These oral recorded sessions will run approximately one to two hours and cover as much as possible of the individual's experience in relation to life in St. Joseph. Specific questions will be asked, along with general questions pertinent to the individual's history. The general questions will be discussed prior to the interview. Interviews will be stored at the St. Joseph Public Library and available to local historians and the public on the St. Joseph Public Library's website.


Roll Cameras!!!

Juvenile Book Club Kits

The St. Joseph Public Library is proud to offer juvenile book club kits for public use. Each kit includes fifteen copies of a single title. This collection features both fiction and non-fiction titles at various reading levels, generally appropriate for children ages seven through twelve.

- A juvenile book club kit is a bag of 15 books checked out to one person.
- All 15 books must be checked out and returned as a complete unit.
- Each juvenile book club kit may be checked out for up to 6 weeks.
- Juvenile book club kits may not be renewed.
- The kits need to be returned at any St. Joseph Public Library branch during regular business hours; they may NOT be returned in the book drop.

The juvenile book club kits are housed at the East Hills Library, but you may pick them up at any of the four St. Joseph Public Library branches by placing a hold. Call the East Hills Library at 236-2136 (or any St. Joseph Public Library branch) to let a librarian know the book club kit that you would like to receive and they will place a hold for you. We currently offer sixteen titles in the juvenile book club collection and hope to add more each year.




Joint Library System Book Cover Redesign Contest








My Grandmother Asked Me to Tell You She's Sorry by Fredrik Backman





Spinach Salad Recipe By Alice Denver

10 oz. pkg. fresh spinach, torn1/2 c. olive oil1 qt. strawberries1/2 c. sugar1/4 c. roasted almonds or pecans1/4 c. vinegar1 T. poppy seed1/4 tsp. paprika2 T. sesame seed1 T. minced onion

Toss together spinach, strawberries and nuts. In another bowl, mix together dressing of poppy seed, sesame seed, oil, sugar, vinegar, paprika and onion. Chill dressing one hour. Pour over spinach and strawberries. Chill 15 minutes.
