A Message from Your Library

The St. Joseph Public Library has been working over the last several months gathering data toward the development of a new long range plan. OrangeBoy, a consulting company, has been leading the activities thus far. They conducted phone interviews with community members, issued an online survey to library cardholders and community members, surveyed library employees, held a session with the Library Board of Trustees and led in-person community forums at the Downtown and East Hills libraries. As you can imagine, a lot of data has been gathered.

The Library Board of Trustees will finalize the areas the library will focus on for the next three to five years, determining how the library can best serve our cardholders and all of our taxpayers. Once that is completed, staff teams will work on short-term, mid-term, and longterm priorities to fit identified needs within the focus areas and finalize the plan.

We appreciate everyone who has taken the time to respond to a survey or participate in a forum. If you haven't had the chance to participate and would like to share your thoughts and ideas, please contact me directly at mrevels@sjpl.lib.mo.us or 816-232-4038. Your input is important and appreciated.

We've got lots of fun, entertaining, and educational programs in store for you as we move into the late fall and winter season. Some new programs we're excited to be able to offer now are cooking programs. We purchased a Kitchen a la Cart that is housed at the Downtown Library with funds donated by Shirley Bradley's estate. We are very thankful for the funding and it has allowed us to make some special purchases for the Downtown Library. Upcoming programs where the kitchen will be featured are 1-2-3 Play With Me: family nutrition, Cook It and Book It for teens, and DIY for adults.

My husband told me a few years ago that the library should do an event on New Year's Eve for people like us who want to do something, but be home before midnight. I am happy to tell you, and my husband Wes, that we plan to offer Live Clue at the Downtown Library on New Year's Eve. The event is a fundraiser for the library and will support capital projects (building improvements, maintenance and repairs) for the library. The cost to attend is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Look for more information about this closer to the date.

Finally, as we get close to ending another year I would like to say thank you to all of our library patrons, volunteers, and supporters who have visited the library, checked out materials, or attended a program over the last year. All of us at the St. Joseph Public Library come to work knowing we are doing important work and appreciate all the support and encouragement you provide.






