A Message from Your Library

For the past several months we have all been dealing with unprecedented challenges that I am sure most of us never imagined we would be facing. I would like to say thank you for the understanding, flexibility, and loyalty you have shown the St. Joseph Public Library through these challenging times.

Thank you for your understanding as we asked you to adapt to the way we serve you in order to keep you and our employees safe.

Thank you for your flexibility in embracing the virtual and contactless ways we've added to how we interact with you.

Thank you for your loyalty to the library, in the past, now, and in the future so that we can continue to provide you with thoughtful, educational, and entertaining materials and resources.

Thank you most of all for the opportunity to continue serving and assisting you during this extraordinary time.

Our library branches returned to contactless service on September 2nd when Buchanan County reached the Orange risk level on the Harvard University Global Epidemics website, https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/. We will reopen the doors for patron visits when Buchanan County returns to the Yellow risk level.

Our original plan was to ask library staff to shelter-in-place if Buchanan County reached the Red risk level. However the Library Board, administration, and staff felt that we could safely continue to offer contactless library services in the midst of the Red risk level as long as we asked staff to take some added precautions. You are important to us and we know we are important to you, too.

Unfortunately, the health threat caused by the pandemic will likely be with us for several more months and we will continue to adapt and figure out ways to keep providing the best and safest library service we can. We will continue to keep you informed as we modify the services we offer.

Lastly, we won't forget that we are all in this together.


Book Match






TUMBLEMATH


