And just like that, summer is almost gone and we are looking forward to fall. It means children are returning to school and for us at SJPL it's time to celebrate Library Card Sign Up Month.

Even though the library is currently offering Contactless Service only under our pandemic protocols, you still have access to the wealth of information and entertainment the library offers. All it takes is a library card. You can also still visit the library to check out a book or a movie, send a fax, scan or make a copy, or even use a computer by appointment at the Downtown or East Hills locations.

You can also visit the library from the comfort of home by using our website to download books, movies, music, TV shows, comics, and magazines. We offer a range of information available at your fingertips through our online informational databases. Legal forms, investment information, car repairs, health information, historic newspapers, genealogical information, and much more is available, and remember, all it takes is a library card to access it. Visit our website at https://sipl.lib.mo.us/databases/ to access all of this great knowledge and entertainment.

EBooks, eAudiobooks, and all eContent is becoming more and more popular and in demand. I am happy to share that we are adding new eBooks and eAudiobooks to the Axis360 consortium collection thanks to a grant. The St. Joseph Public Library was recently awarded an ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) grant totaling \$30,000 by the Offices of John R. Ashcroft, Secretary of State. This grant is supported by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) under the provisions of the American Rescue Plan Act as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State.

The purpose of the grant is to purchase eBooks and eAudiobooks for the Axis360 Grand River Digital Library Consortium that consists of 19 member libraries in Missouri including SJPL. Member libraries share the collection of eBooks and eAudiobooks through the Axis360 software platform. SJPL, along with the Rolling Hills Library, will be ordering the grant funded eBooks and eAudiobooks on behalf of the whole consortium.

SJPL continues to be here for you, whether you need to learn something, research something, or just relax with a good book or movie.

Book-A-Librarian


If you'd like more one-on-one time with us, here is your chance to have a visit with your favorite library friends through Book-A-Librarian!
