The St. Joseph Public Library Foundation is selling holiday cards at the four branches of the St. Joseph Public Library as a fundraiser.



Shop the Friends of the St. Joseph Public Library Book Sale and stack up some bargains. This year the sale will take place in the new book sale room at the Downtown Library, 927 Felix St. Hardcover books are \$2 each, paperbacks, DVDs and CDs are \$1 each. During the "bag and box day," from 4 p.m. – 7 p.m., non-profit organizations and teachers can have books for free when they show proof of tax exemption or school ID. Those wanting to participate in the free book giveaway need to check in at the register upon arrival.

The items are sorted into categories to make shopping easy. There are many fiction books, as usual, for people to collect their favorite authors or to browse for reading ideas, and there are separate sections for romance, mystery, westerns, science fiction and fantasy, which are always popular. In addition, there will be a huge section of fiction and non-fiction children's books available. There are also several categories of non-fiction, including history, biography, art, religion, cooking and more. There are approximately 10,000 items in this year's sale.

The Friends of the St. Joseph Public Library is a non-profit organization formed to support literacy and the public library system. Proceeds from the sale help fund Summer Reading Programs for all ages at the four library branches, as well as books for book clubs. The Friends also give free books to children at St. Joseph Juneteenth and Pumpkinfest celebrations.




