Library News

A Message from Your Library

September may not be the beginning of the year, but it always gives off the aura of newness to me. A new school year is just beginning and even though it is still hot outside, signs of fall are starting to emerge. Of course, this is 2020 so we're not having a typical September. One thing that is the same as in years past is that we are celebrating Library Card Sign-Up Month. This year's theme is Libraries are Wonderful and we have some wonderfully fun activities for you to do this month. Read all about it in the newsletter!

Something new for us at the library is offering mobile hotspots to check out. You can "checkout the world" with one of 20 new hotspots. The mobile hotspot project is supported by the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act, as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State.

That's the official wording I have to use related to the grant funding we received. In plain language, I am thrilled the St. Joseph Public Library received grant funding connected to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Those funds allowed us to purchase 20 T-Mobile hotspots, along with two years of service.

The hotspots may be checked out for three weeks, and if no one else is waiting they can be renewed twice. One person, 17 years of age or older, per household is welcome to check out a hotspot, as long as they have a valid St. Joseph Public Library card in good standing and sign a checkout agreement.

The new hotspots are an extension of the free WiFi service offered at all of the library branches. But now that connection can be taken home. The hotspot provides internet access to up to 15 devices at a time. It is portable so devices can be connected at home, in the park, or even on vacation.

With the mobile hotspot program we hope to reach families who might not have access to the internet at home, people who need access to apply for a job or housing, those who want to connect to our online or streaming services, or just anyone who wants to connect in all of the ways that many of us take for granted.

Ask a librarian at any of our branches how to check out a hotspot, or put one on reserve yourself by searching "hotspot" in our online catalog.

St. Joseph is a diverse community with a variety of information needs, and we are happy to continue to offer new solutions from the library that help make life better.






Book Match

Library Card Virtual Scavenger Hunt




