

Local History Librarian Wins Award

In its inaugural year, the Missouri Library Association's Genealogy and Local History Committee of Interest chose Jennifer Sanders-Tutt, Local History Librarian at the St. Joseph Public Library, as the first recipient of the Excellence in Genealogy and Local History Award. The committee considered all the programs and projects she has developed during her time at the St. Joseph Public Library, including History Speaks, the Oral History Project, and Local History Week. However, it was Jennifer's working with the St. Joseph City Council to establish the correct founding date of the city, July 26, 1843, and the establishment of an annual Founder's Day that particularly stood out to them.

The Excellence in Genealogy and Local History Award is sponsored by the Genealogy and Local History Committee of Interest and is given annually to recognize and honor excellence in the field of genealogy and local history for Missouri libraries, repositories, and staff.
