



## A Message from Your Library



The St. Joseph Public Library has been sharing books and information since 1890, when the citizens of St. Joseph voted to establish and fund a Public Library.

For 126 years and counting, sharing books and other materials continues to be at the heart of what we do. Plenty of people still come into the library to check out physical materials, but more and more people are turning to e-content for convenience. Some of our e-content providers changed in the new year so I thought a rundown on what we offer would be helpful.

**Blackstone Unlimited:** eAudiobooks that are always available to check out.

**CloudLibrary:** eBooks and eAudiobooks. We are a member of a small consortium of libraries and we try to purchase copies of adult bestsellers. Bonus: wait times for bestsellers are typically shorter than on Libby.

**Hoopla:** always available eBook, eAudiobooks, eMagazines, and streaming music, movies, and television. Hoopla charges us for every checkout so each cardholder has a monthly checkout limit, and the library has a monthly spending cap too. This is a popular service, so if you get a message that you can't check out what you want, try again the next morning.

**Kanopy:** streaming movies and TV shows. Stream on your device: phones, tablets, computers, and smart TVs too.

**Libby** (app) also known as **Missouri Libraries to Go** (desktop version): eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines, and some streaming services like *The Great Courses*, *Craftsy*, *Qello Concerts*, and *Indiefix*. You'll find lots of bestsellers here too but wait times can be long because we are a member of a large consortium. Check CloudLibrary to see if the wait time is shorter!

**Tumblebook** eBooks are animated, talking picture books that entertain and also teach kids the joy of reading.

I am not sure the library has been offering programs for all of our 126 years, but they are an essential part of our services now. From preschool storytimes to programs about navigating adulthood, to art classes, cooking classes, crafts, movies and more. We regularly provide programming six days a week, and sometimes even seven!

We also frequently partner with groups and organizations for programs or events. March is Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month, and we are partnering with Progressive Community Services to show the documentary *The Ride Ahead*. The movie is about Samuel Habib, who is a typical 21-year-old, itching to move out, start a career, and find love. He must also navigate the challenges of thriving with a disability. Join us on Thursday, March 5 at 6 p.m. at the East Hills Library for the movie and a short question/answer session afterward.

Did I mention we also offer computers, copiers, printers, and Wi-Fi? Visit one of our four St. Joseph Public Library locations and find out for yourself all we have on offer.
