

A Message from Your Library

Library News

Public libraries are known for making do and carrying on when obstacles arise. However, like many other organizations and individuals in the United States right now, SJPL is facing challenges. Our budget has been adversely affected with the prospect of additional funding cuts to come.

To be clear, the majority of funding that SJPL receives is from our local taxpayers. Thank you! However, we also receive funding from the State of Missouri and from the Federal government. Federally, we receive funds from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), typically through grants administered by the Missouri State Library and recently from an organization called Lifetime Arts. The State Library also receives funds from IMLS that are used to fund statewide programs such as the statewide courier that delivers materials between libraries throughout Missouri and the Missouri Evergreen Consortium, our new checkout system that allows easy access to over 80 other library systems. As of the March 14 Executive Order issued by President Trump, IMLS is in jeopardy.

Historically IMLS funding has strengthened our library system. I equate it to providing a strong foundation that allows us to build on. Statewide services and programs that have been partially funded with federal money will cost more if IMLS funding is not restored. We will have to find a new source of funding to replace the grants that we rely on for necessary technology updates and offering new programs.

For example, the Creative Aging Art classes we began hosting in the fall of 2024 will no longer be funded by IMLS. Of the \$14,996.53 that we spent to offer them, only \$5,170.76 was reimbursed before the cancelation letter was delivered to Lifetime Arts, the organization that administered the grant. The letter stated "IMLS has determined that your grant is unfortunately no longer consistent with the agency's priorities and no longer serves the interest of the United States and the IMLS Program." The participants who attended would disagree with this heartily.

The loss of this promised funding is not insignificant for us. Bracing for additional funding losses while also facing higher operating costs has translated into a hiring freeze at SJPL. Due to staff changes at the Downtown Library, we made the decision to reduce hours. Beginning in mid-May the Downtown Library began closing at 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday, instead of 8 p.m.

Times may be tough, but we are not going away. SJPL is known for our neighborhood libraries and that is not changing. We are still here for you and your family, dedicated to providing great programs and services, and are looking forward to the "Color Our World" Summer Reading Program for babies, children and teens that begins on June 1. We appreciate that you are here for us too.
