The St. Joseph Public Library is asking voters on Tuesday, August 8, 2017 to renew the 15-cent portion of our levy that is not permanent. We are asking that the 15 cents, which was originally approved in 1999, be extended for another twenty years.

The library receives about 95% of our yearly revenue from the local tax levy. Our total levy is 42 cents. 27 cents is permanent, and the 15 cents has a sunset. That 42 cents funds our operating expenses, keeping the four library branches open and serving our community.

Continuing the 15-cent levy for another 20 years will:

- Provide for daily operating costs, including utilities and payroll at the branches.
- Allow us to update computers, the technology infrastructure and internet, and wireless access at the branches.
- Enable us to purchase more books, audiobooks, movies, and other material. Provide more resources for entrepreneurs, small businesses and job seekers. We want to add individual and collaborative study rooms in the branches.
- Increase programming and outreach for all ages, adding to the programming for babies through senior adults we currently provide.
- Maintain and improve buildings and grounds.
- Restore branch hours that were cut in 2008. That means returning to full 6-day a week service at Carnegie and Washington Park and 7-day a week service at the Downtown branch.

Why are we asking for a sunset if we expect this tax to be used for daily operations? Simply put, we know the citizens of St. Joseph appreciate a sunset on taxes. This gives people the opportunity to say, "Yes, we think you have been a good steward and we want the services you provide to continue."

Books are just the beginning. St. Joseph Public Libraries offer programs for all ages. We provide training courses and access to technology for job seekers. We provide resources and networking events for small business owners. We help prepare children for kindergarten, beginning with early literacy development for babies, and we continue supporting our community's children throughout their education.

Please vote on Tuesday, August 8. Encourage your friends and family who live in the St. Joseph Public Library District to vote, also. This is an important issue, not just for us, but for our community. Public libraries have always been the great equalizers and alternative education centers in our communities. The St. Joseph Public Library has been an integral institution in our community since 1890 with four branches available throughout the city and we want to continue that role for all citizens.
